Nature Notes

- § This week gains 13 minutes of sunlight and some songbirds are starting to stake out their territories by singing in the morning and evening. See if you can identify them by their songs before you see them.
- § Raccoons, coyotes, muskrats and cottontail rabbits can be mating this time of year already. Their young are born later when the spring food supply is most plentiful for the mothers to be able to eat enough to feed their young.
- § With warming temperatures, don't be surprised if you see a few moths come out after dark as they are some of the first insects to take a chance. I've already seen lady bugs stirring in the warming daylight as well as green stink bugs already out looking for food.
- § In addition to bluebird and duck nesting box preparation, if you have a bat box, now is a good time to prepare for their needs as well. Many bats have died from "white nose syndrome" in the northeast, but it has spread as far west as Kansas City and Omaha, which is knocking on our doorstep. With very high mortality, this could mean an upswing in insects normally controlled by bats, including mosquitoes.
- § This is another great week for hiking to see wildlife, especially around sunrise/sunset. Grab a friend and go to your favorite/new area to explore--you won't regret it!
