

Nature Notes

- Check out native prairies for blooming wildflowers such as leadplant, oxeye daisy, sensitivebrier, black eyed susan, beebalm, culver's root, white wild indigo, echinacea, and many others. Where can you do this? Try for starters Prairie Park Nature Center, the Kansas Land Trust Akin Prairie, KU Field Station Rockefeller Prairie Trail. Clinton Sanders Mound and Grant-Bradbury Park in Topeka.
- Roadsides are another place to find wildflowers and not-sowildflowers, including invasive weeds such as crown vetch and canada musk thistle, both of which are blooming right now. Imports such as the fading yellow sweet clover and the newly blooming white sweet clover and Queen Anne's lace are easy to spot in ditches, as well as rough leafed dogwood which continues to bloom.
- Birthing and raising young continue to be the major activities of area mammals and birds: roadkills are a real issue this time of year, affecting entire families, so drive carefully!
- Dry, windy weather is reducing lightning bugs but increasing dragonfly and grasshopper activity, as warm nights increase insect activity, especially after rains, which we'll hopefully get soon!
