

§ Echinacea, milkweeds, Culver's root, lead plant, blackeyed susan, yarrow, gray coneflower, slender mountain mint, bee balm and sensitivebrier continue to bloom while rattlesnakemaster has headed out and compassplant is shooting up its flower stalk. Still a great time to learn your prairie wildflowers.

§ Katydid have begun to add their call to the night sounds; go out on a summer night to see if you can identify all of the other sounds: which frog or toad? Which insect? Which owl are you hearing and can you make out a whippoorwill or chuck will's widow? Many animals are nocturnal this time of year to avoid the heat; it's a great time to enjoy the natural fireworks of the firefly and heat lightning while you're at it.

§ Sycamores are shedding their bark while their seedheads are beginning to turn reddish brown and Kansas dogwood berries are green. Osage orange balls are growing and black walnuts are the size of shelled pecans. Hedge parsley/sticktites seeds of maturing and look for more and more spiderwebs.

§ Galls are forming on many leaves and stems on area plants, caused by insects laying eggs that prompt the plant to grow a bump that protects the larva, almost like a green pearl. Dragonflies are prolific this year; they eat lots of mosquitoes!
